<p>9th - English I</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Standard English curriculum ● Rarely more than 10 pages of independent reading per week ● Write four essays per semester 	<p>9th - Honors English I</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Prepares students for the rigor of AP English courses ● Up to 10 pages of independent reading per night ● Formal analysis writing assignments every week ranging from a paragraph to a full essay
<p>10th - English II</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Standard English curriculum ● Rarely more than 10 pages of independent reading per week ● Write four essays per semester 	<p>10th - Honors English II</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Prepares students for the rigor of AP English courses ● Up to 15 pages of independent reading per night ● Formal analysis writing assignments every week ● At least seven full essays per semester
<p>11th - English III</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Standard English curriculum ● Rarely more than 15 pages of independent reading per week ● Write four essays per semester 	<p>11th - AP English Language and Composition</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Course focuses on nonfiction readings, rhetorical analysis, and essay writing ● Prepares students for the rigor of college coursework as well as the national AP exam, which can result in college credit ● Up to 20 pages of independent reading per night ● Multiple formal analysis writing assignments every week ● Regular timed in-class essays and edited, typed take-home essays
<p>12th - English IV</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Standard English curriculum ● Rarely more than 15 pages of independent reading per week ● Write four essays per semester 	<p>12th - AP English Literature and Composition</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Course focuses on fiction readings, literary analysis, and essay writing ● Prepares students for the rigor of college coursework as well as the national AP exam, which can result in college credit ● Up to 20 pages of independent reading per night ● Multiple formal analysis writing assignments every week ● Regular timed in-class essays and edited, typed take-home essays
